A brief synopsis and explanation of the following:

An Ordinance, pursuant to Alabama Act 1969-916, authorizing the Mayor and/or the Chief of Police to execute an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, for a period not to exceed three (3) years, between the City of Birmingham and the UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT ("ICE"), for the purpose of cooperation and coordination for the effective enforcement of the laws relating to ICE's HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS ("HSI") jurisdiction, by designating certain Officers of the Birmingham Police Department ("BPD") as Customs Officers authorized to enforce the full range of federal criminal offenses. The City will be eligible for possible distribution of some seized money and assets. The assigned BPD Officers will not be responsible for enforcing civil violations of immigration law, including civil detention or deportation. And further authorizing The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police, and any designated BPD Officer who successfully completes the HSI Task Force Officer cross-designation Training Course, to execute any additional documents necessary to accomplish the purposes of the Agreement.

ORDINANCE NO.

TO AUTHORIZE AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA AND UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS

WHEREAS, The CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA (the "City") is a municipal corporation established pursuant the laws of the State of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT ('ICE") HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS ("HSI"), is a federal agency; and

WHEREAS, ICE HSI and the City desire to contract for the purpose of cooperation and coordination for the effective enforcement of laws relating to ICE HSI jurisdiction, by designating certain officers of the Birmingham Police Department ("BPD") as Customs Officers authorized to enforce the full range of federal offenses, excluding administrative violations of immigration law; and

WHEREAS, ICE HSI is authorized to designate Customs Officers pursuant to Titles 19 U.S.C. § 1401(i) and 19 U.S.C. § 1589a; and

WHEREAS, Act 1969-916 of the Acts of Alabama (the "Act") authorizes Jefferson County and the municipalities, other governmental subdivisions and public corporations in Jefferson County to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate with the state, the federal government and with each other on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities in a manner and pursuant to forms of governmental organization that will accord best with geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs and developments of the county and municipalities and other governmental units and agencies therein; and

WHEREAS, BPD values its relationship with HSI and has assigned Officers and Detectives as Task Force Officers to work with HSI to investigate crimes that impact the public safety and well-being of our community; and

WHEREAS, HSI is the principle investigative arm of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security with broad law enforcement authority to investigate all federal crime and with primary jurisdiction over 400 federal crimes; and

WHEREAS, HSI's primary mission is to investigate transnational criminal organizations and other networks whose actions threaten to exploit public safety and national security; and

WHEREAS, BPD employees assigned to HSI as Task Force Officers, will not, by virtue of the cooperative agreement/memorandum of understanding and this ordinance, participate in any immigration enforcement activities and the authorities granted to sworn Task Force Officers do not grant them the authority to act as immigration officers as defined under 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(18); and

WHEREAS, BPD employees assigned to HSI as Task Force Officers will only investigate criminal activity as defined under federal and Alabama state law as they relate to the mission of HSI to include such crimes as; human trafficking, child exploitation, and other forms of human exploitation; drug trafficking; financial crimes, such as money laundering; firearms offenses and violent crime; illicit trade; and other such offenses that directly impact the public's safety and wellbeing;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Birmingham, Alabama as follows:

SECTION 1. The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police of the City of Birmingham, Alabama is hereby authorized, in accordance with the provisions of Act 1969-916, to enter into the attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of Birmingham and the UNITED STATES IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT ("ICE"), for the purpose of cooperation and coordination for the effective enforcement of the laws relating to ICE's HOMELAND SECURITY INVESTIGATIONS ("HSI") jurisdiction, by designating certain officers of the Birmingham Police Department ("BPD") as Customs Officers authorized to enforce the full range of federal offenses, excluding administrative violations of immigration law. The assigned BPD Officers will complete the appropriate HSI Task Force Officer cross-designation Training Course prior to being designated as Customs Officer (Excepted). The City will be eligible for possible distribution of some seized money and assets. Neither party shall assume any risk or future liability, or any future responsibility for any of the property of the other party or for the actions of any employee or officer of the other party. No party to the contract shall have any power to incur any debt which shall become the responsibility of any other contracting party. The Term of the Agreement shall not exceed a period of three (3) years from its effective date. The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police, and any designated BPD Officer who successfully completes the HSI Task Force Officer cross-designation Training Course, is further authorized to execute any additional documents necessary to accomplish the purposes of the Agreement.

SECTION 2. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any of these sections, provisions, sentences, clauses phrases, or parts is held to be unconstitutional or void, the remainder shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall become effective by law.	ective upon publication or as otherwise required

 compensation under the Federal Employee Workers Compensation Act (5 U.S.C. § 8101, et seq.).

Birmingham Police Depart agrees:

- a. That only sworn law enforcement officers of <u>Birmingham Police Department</u> who successfully complete the appropriate HSI Task Force Officer cross-designation Training Course and receive an approved "Designation, Customs Officer (Excepted) Title 19 Task Force Officer" (ICE Form 73-001) will be designated as Customs Officers (Excepted);
- That each law enforcement officer will be bound by the Authorities Granted and the Endorsements and Restrictions as noted on the "Designation, Customs Officer (Excepted) - Title 19 Task Force Officer" (ICE Form 73-001);
- To advise HSI of each court preceeding in which the validity of a Customs Officer (Excepted)'s
 enforcement authority becomes an issue, and allow HSI to provide legal memoranda or other assistance
 as deemed necessary by HSI;
- That agency employees designated as Customs Officers (Excepted) will follow HSI directives and instructions when utilizing enforcement authority conveyed by HSI;
- To provide to HSI, before designation of each officer and on an ongoing basis, any derogatory information, or information that may call into question the officer's truthfulness or ability to testify in court; and
- f. To return all HSI-issued equipment and identification when a cross-designated officer terminates employment or when his or her cross-designation expires.

Both Parties saree:

- That any abuse of HSI cross-designation authority may lead to the revocation of such cross-designations by HSI; and
- To schedule periodic meetings to review this MOU, as required.
- REPORTING AND DOCUMENTATION. HSI SAC offices will maintain the original signed "Designation, Customs Officer (Excepted) — Title 19 Task Force Officer" (ICE Form 73-001). Copies of this form will be held by the Contraband Smuggling Unit at HSI Headquarters, the designated Customs Officer (Excepted), and Birmin ham Police Designation.

If applicable, the HSI office will maintain documentation of designated Customs Officers (Excepted) approved to use HSI vehicles and certification that the designated Customs Officers (Excepted) have completed the ICE Fleet Card Training in Virtual University and any other fleet related training.

Nothing in this MOU is intended to conflict with current laws, regulations, or policies of either Party. If a term of this MOU is inconsistent with such authority, that term shall be invalid but the remaining terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain in full force and effect.

Nothing in this MOU is intended or shall be construed to require the obligation, appropriation, or expenditure of any money from the U.S. Treasury in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C. §§ 1341-1519.

The forms and authorities referenced herein may be renamed or replaced by HSI without prejudice to this MOU.

- EFFECTIVE DATE. The terms of this MOU will become effective on the date the last Party signs the MOU. The Designation Form of each Customs Officer (Excepted) is effective per the date on that document.
- MODIFICATION. This MOU may be amended by the written concurrence of both Parties.
- TERMINATION. This MOU may be terminated by either Party upon a 30-day written notification to the other Party.
